The RCTF was established in September 2020 to understand more about the barriers to improving cellular and internet coverage in rural Saskatchewan.

The task force spent months meeting with industry experts and service providers to fully understand the magnitude of the issue.

Once all its information was collected, the task force identi ed 43 recommendations to improve cellular and internet coverage in rural Saskatchewan.
